BUY IT

It is important you set a realistic budget before you begin your planning. Consider every item you will need to purchase and put a figure next to it. COLOUR IT

Choosing a colour palette at the start will ensure you make purchases that will work together a create a cohesive space. Choose 3-5 colours that you love and that work well together and stick to them.

Impulse buying will always cost you more in the long run – have your colour swatches with you when you shop to keep you on track!

STORE IT

Kids have stuff! Lots of it! Make sure you plan includes storage for clothes, essential items (such as nappies and wipes) and toys/books. Make use of built in cupboards as much as possible. Stylish storage baskets or bags can actually enhance the style of your room so don't be afraid to use them!

Rotate toys from harder to reach storage to easily accessed storage bags or baskets to keep your little loves interested.

INSTALL IT
